




Trumps Green Reading News

Reading Books

Each week your child will bring home 3 books. They will have read their reading practice book three times in school before they bring it home so they should read this with good fluency.

Your child will also bring home a sharing and library book every week. These are books that are to be shared with and read to/with your child to help develop their engagement with and enjoyment of reading. Please remember that you shouldn't expect your child to read this alone. Read it to or with them. Discuss the pictures, enjoy the story, predict what might happen next, use different voices for the characters, explore the facts in a non-fiction book. The main thing is that you have fun!

Bedtime Book Bags

We're very excited by our new Bedtime Book Bags. Enjoy our bedtime books snuggled up with a hot chocolate and our reading owls. Take a photo to stick in our Bedtime Book scrap book and tell us what you thought of the books. Everyone in the class will get a go. Enjoy!

Top Tips to encourage reading

Did you know reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success? That's why we are so passionate about reading at Trumps Green.

Here are some tips to help your child develop a reading habit:

- Set aside a special time just a few minutes a day is enough to create a reading habit.
- Get caught reading yourself show that reading for pleasure is not just for children.
- Read to each other if your child really doesn't want to read on their own, then read together. You read a page, then they read a page. Or one of you could read any dialogue. Be brave and put on different voices.
- Value the books they choose to read all reading is valuable for a child's development. Some of us prefer non-fiction; some of us prefer comics. One child might like superhero books; another might a book of football statistics.
- Reading buddies reading to a younger sibling can boost your child's self-confidence and communication skills.
- Audiobooks audiobooks allow children to experience a book above their own reading level. It also allows you to share a book together or make the most of those car journeys. Listening to a story over and over again can improve vocabulary and encourage deeper comprehension.



Book Recommendations


This half term we have been loving:

In Aaron Becker's Journey we follow a girl on an elaborate flight of fancy in a wondrously illustrated, wordless picture book about self-determination and unexpected friendship.
