You may be aware that from 25 May 2018, the rules around data protection changed. The 'General Data Protection Regulation' (GDPR) changed how we can use your personal data and keep it safe. It also strengthened your rights over your own data.

The point of this is to make sure sensitive or private information about yourselves and your children stays safe. Our privacy notice can be found both in this pack and on our website.

As part of our work to comply with the GDPR, we are also seeking consent for:

Where it is legally required, or necessary (and it complies with GDPR) we may share personal information about students with:

- Professional advisers and consultants
- Charities and voluntary organisations
- Police forces, courts, tribunals
- Professional bodies

### National Pupil Database (NPD)

We are required to provide information about students to the Department for Education as part of statutory data collections such as the school census.

Some of this information is then stored in the National Pupil Database (NPD), which is owned and managed by the Department and provides evidence on school performance to inform research.

The database is held electronically so it can easily be turned into statistics. The information is securely collected from a range of sources including schools, local authorities and exam boards.

## **Data Sharing - Consent Form**

The Department for Education may share information from the NPD with other organisations which promote children's education or wellbeing in England. Such organisations must agree to strict terms and conditions about how they will use the data.
