Painting	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Begin to make recognisable marks in paint using different brush sizes.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use a variety of tools and techniques including different brush sizes and types.</li> <li>• Begin to control the pressure and direction of brushstrokes.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Experiment with tools and techniques e.g. layering, mixing media, scraping through.</li> <li>• Create textured paint by adding sand, plaster, etc.</li> </ul>
Printing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Print with a range of hard and soft materials e.g. corks, pen barrels, sponge.</li> <li>• Make prints using block colours.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Build repeating patterns.</li> <li>• Begin to combine colours.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Make simple marks on rollers and printing palettes.</li> <li>• Take simple prints i.e. mono-printing.</li> <li>• Roll printing ink over found objects to create patterns e.g. plastic mesh, stencils.</li> <li>• Create simple printing blocks with press print.</li> </ul>
Colour	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify primary colours by name.</li> <li>• Begin to informally mix colours.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify a wide range of colours by name.</li> <li>• Begin to formally mix primary colours to create other known ones.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Begin to mix colours to make corrections.</li> <li>• Mix and match colours to artefacts and objects.</li> </ul>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use and name a range of tools to make coloured marks on paper</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Make as many tones of one colour as possible (using white).</li> <li>Darken colours without using black.</li> <li>Use colour on a large scale.</li> </ul>
Texture	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Make rubbings to collect textures.</li> <li>Create simple collages from a range of materials.</li> <li>Arrange and glue materials to different backgrounds.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sort and group materials for different purposes e.g. colour texture.</li> <li>Fold, crumple, tear and overlap papers.</li> <li>Begin to learn how textiles are used to create things.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Create and arrange shapes appropriately, overlapping and overlaying to create effects.</li> <li>Collage: Collect, sort, name match colours appropriate for an image.</li> <li>Create own textured paper for an image.</li> <li>Work on different scales.</li> </ul>
3D Modelling	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Manipulate malleable materials in a variety of ways.</li> <li>Experiment with constructing and joining recycled, natural and manmade materials.</li> <li>Use simple 2D shapes to create a 3D form, e.g. in construction activities.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Replicate patterns and textures in 3D form.</li> <li>Manipulate malleable materials for a purpose, e.g. pot, tile.</li> <li>Understand the safety and basic care of materials and tools.</li> <li>Make simple joins.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Develop an awareness of natural and man-made forms.</li> <li>Explore sculpture with a range of malleable media.</li> <li>Begin to shape and form from direct observation.</li> <li>Begin to learn about a range of sculptors.</li> <li>Begin to express personal experiences and ideas.</li> </ul>

<p>Textiles</p>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Match and sort fabrics and threads for colour, texture, length, size and shape.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cut and shape fabric using scissors/snips.</li> <li>• Apply shapes with glue or by stitching.</li> <li>• Use large eyed needles.</li> <li>• Try running stitch and start to explore other simple stitches.</li> <li>• Attempt some simple appliqué work.</li> <li>• Apply decoration using beads, buttons, feathers etc.</li> <li>• Change and modify threads and fabrics, knotting, fraying, fringing, pulling threads, twisting, plaiting.</li> </ul>
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
