

SPORTS PREMIUM FUNDING

Details for the Academic Year 2016-2017. The final allocation of funding for 2016/17 was £8,600.

What is Sports Premium?

For the previous three academic years, the Government has allocated additional funding to improve the quality and provision of Physical Education and School Sport in Primary Schools. Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that schools should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Examples of how schools can spend this money include:

- hiring qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life (<http://www.nhs.uk/change4life/Pages/change-for-life.aspx>) clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils' participation in the School Games (<https://www.gov.uk/government/policies/getting-more-people-playing-sport/supporting-pages/the-school-games>)
- run sport competitions
- Engage PE specialists to provide a wider range of sport activities for pupils
